**From Columbus:** exit I-70 east at 7<sup>th</sup> Street, take an immediate left on Elberon Avenue to Underwood St. Turn left and follow SR 60/146 to Maple Avenue. Turn right and go north on Maple for 2.5 miles to Brandywine Blvd. Turn left at Brandywine Blvd. and the church is on the left about ½ a mile.

**From Wheeling:** exit I-70 west at the SR 60/146 Underwood Street exit, turn right on Underwood St. Follow SR 60/146 to Maple Avenue. Turn right and go north on Maple for 2.5 miles to Brandywine Blvd. Turn left at Brandywine Blvd. and the church is on the left about ½ a mile.

## “100 years of World Scouting”

### Morning Session and Afternoon Workshop Descriptions

**Measuring District Performance:** How do you know if your district is successful in fulfilling the promise of Scouting? Discover the tools you have available to you. Codes A1, B1.

**Council Long Range Planning Strategies:** We preach planning as a way to achieve our goals but many councils lack a comprehensive long range plan. Pick up valuable tips in putting together a plan for your council’s future. Codes A2, B2.

**Risk Management and Youth Protection delivery:** Discuss how effective Risk Management practices can insure a safe environment in any Scouting setting and share your best methods in providing YPT to all volunteers. Codes A3, B3.

**Building Youth Tenure:** Discover and share ways to keep youth in Scouting longer and programs available to help. Codes A4, B4.

**Developing your Roundtable Team:** Want great Roundtables? They start with great scouters who work as a team. Discuss the best practices that can make it happen. Codes A5, B5.

**Scouting: Management vs. Leadership:** Many people confuse leadership just with running an event or committee. Find out ways that all of us can provide leadership without being the leader. Codes A6, B6.

**Conservation Education ideas:** The outdoors serves as Scouting’s laboratory. Our challenge is to be more aware of how we teach one another to appreciate and care for the environment. Come ready to learn and share! Codes A7, B7.

**Conducting Unit Committee Training:** All scouters need training but most unit committee members neglect to receive it formally. Discuss ways to make it interesting, fun and meaningful. Codes A8, B8.

**Council Training Committee Workshop:** This workshop deals with operations to make your training program effective and relevant. Code W1.

**Council Advancement Committee Workshop:** Discuss and share best practices to ensure young people get the recognition they deserve in Scouting, maintaining Merit Badge counselor lists and Court of Honor ideas to share. Code W2.

**Council/District Activities Workshop:** Share and discover new and interesting applications of this committee function to enhance your district and council program. Code W3.

**Council Wood Badge Coordinators Workshop:** A workshop for all council coordinators and those interested in a successful Wood Badge program. Code W4.

**Council NYLT Leadership Workshop:** This workshop is for councils with successful NYLT courses and the one to attend if your council wants to offer a course. Code W5.

**Council /District Commissioners Workshop:** Discuss and share proven methods to perform this essential service to units, districts and councils. Code W6.

**Council Program Vice Presidents Workshop:** Meet with other program leaders to discuss responsibilities and share methods to best deliver the Promise of Scouting. Code W7.

**Council Marketing Committees Workshop:** 3M means, Marketing Motivates Membership! Get some great tips to spread the word out about Scouting. Code W8.

**Council Venturing Operations Workshop:** Get some great ideas from area leaders about how to deliver Scouting’s newest and fastest growing program. Code W9.

**Regional Resident Camp Visitation Training:** Receive certification to serve on a Resident Camp Visitation Team. Your Scout Executive must approve your attendance prior to October 27. Code W10.
